Shikaripalya Main Road: A Dire Situation for Over 2000 Residents

Residents of Shikaripalya Main Road in Hulimangala, Electronics City, are grappling with dangerous road conditions. After being dug up to lay drainage pipes, the road was left unrepaired, leading to the development of massive potholes. With half the road now completely unusable, vehicles, including school buses and trucks, are forced to drive on the wrong side of the narrow, remaining stretch, posing serious risks to pedestri-

ans and motorists alike. The situation has worsened with the onset of the rainy season, causing numerous accidents, particularly for two-wheeler

Residents, frustrated and fearful for their safety, are urging local authorities to address the issue immediately and restore the road

Pragathi Nagar's Kaveri Water Request: MLA's Assurance



Residents of Pragathi Nagar met Mr. M. Krishnappa, MLA of Bangalore South, to request Kaveri water connections for their area. The MLA responded positively, stating that 95% of the work related to Kaveri water and storage is completed, with only 5% pending. He advised residents to submit applications to the concerned officer, who would then inspect the area. As per BWSSB standards, once the deposit is paid, the MLA assured that he would personally coordinate with the chairman to expedite the provision of Kaveri water, regardless of the remaining work.

The Water Crisis in Bangalore A Stark Contrast to the Visionary Planning of Maharaja Krishna Raja Wadiyar IV

Bangalore, often hailed as India's Silicon Valley, stands as a testament to rapid urbanization and development. However, beneath the glittering facade of IT parks and modern infrastructure lies a critical issue that plagues several parts of the city-water scarcity. Pragathi Nagar, Basapura, Chikka Thogur and surrounding areas, which fall under the jurisdiction of the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP), have been grappling with severe water shortages for years. This issue, which impacts thousands of residents, underscores the larger problem of inadequate urban planning and the lack of political will to address basic infrastructural needs.

The irony is stark when one considers Bangalore's history, particularly during the reign of Maharaja Krishna Raja Wadiyar IV of the Mysore dynasty. Often referred to as the "Modern Architect of Mysore," the Maharaja was a visionary ruler who placed immense importance on town planning and infrastructure development. His reign saw the creation of some of Bangalore's most well-planned areas, such as Jayanagar

and Rajajinagar, which continue to be celebrated examples of urban planning. Furthermore, his foresight in constructing the Krishna Raja Sagara (KRS) dam across the Kaveri River not only provided irrigation water for multiple districts but also supplied drinking water and electricity, benefiting both urban and rural popu-

66In stark contrast, the cur-

rent situation in Pragathi Nagar and Basapura highlights the failure of contemporary governance. Despite being part of a major metropolitan city, these areas are still dependent on private water suppliers for their daily needs. The lack of a sustainable and affordable water supply is a glaring issue that BBMP has been unable to address effectively. The rapid expansion of Bangalore's boundaries under BBMP, driven more by revenue generation and vote-bank politics than by thoughtful planning, has only exacerbated the problem??

The residents of these areas have now taken it upon themselves to monitor the progress of water supply initiatives actively, a task that ideally should have been

managed by the authorities. Water, a fundamental human need, remains a luxury in these parts of Bangalore, showcasing a clear disconnect between the city's growth and the provision of essential services.

Reflecting on the planning during Maharaja Krishna Raja Wadiyar IV's time, it is evident that the lack of foresight in today's urban planning & governance is taking a heavy toll on the citizens of Bangalore. The water crisis in Pragathi Nagar and Basapura is not just a local issue but a symptom of a broader systemic failure. It is high time that the lessons from the past, particularly the Maharaja's visionary approach to infrastructure, are revisited to build a sustainable future for all residents of Bangalore.


This event was a proud moment for all of us, as we had the privilege of welcoming such a remarkable personality to our campus. Dr. Murthy Remi-

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

Haemorrhoids

Haemorrhoids are swollen veins in the lower rectum or anus that can cause discomfort, pain, and bleeding. They are a common condition that affects millions of people worldwide

Types of haemorrhoids:

Internal haemorrhoids: Located inside the rectum, these are typically painless but may cause bleeding.

External haemorrhoids: Located under the skin around the anus, these can be painful and may

cause itching and swelling.

Treatment options:

Dietary changes (increasing fiber and water intake)

Over-the-counter pain relievers and creams

Sitz baths (warm water soaks)

Medical procedures (such as rubber band ligation or sclerotherapy)

Surgery (in severe cas-

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Understanding and Treating Brain Aneurysms & Subarachnoid Hemorrhage

Stroke primarily includes two types: ischemic stroke (blockage of blood vessels leading to brain damage), hemorrhagic stroke. In Hemorrhagic stroke, there are many types. In intracerebral hemorrhage (bleeding within the brain from ruptured vessels due to high blood pressure), and subarachnoid hemorrhage (SAH) involving bleeding on the brain's surface. SAH, often caused by brain aneurysms, is less common but particularly severe.

the risks and recoveries from SAH. Clarke survived two instances of SAH and continued her acting career, while Stone took seven years to fully recover from her 2001 SAH.

A brain aneurysm is a balloon-like bulge in a blood vessel, which can rupture, causing SAH. Symptoms often include sudden, severe headaches, nausea, or vomiting. Sometimes aneurysms rupture without immediate symptoms,

Notable cases like Emilia Clarke's and Sharon Stone's have highlighted

leading to unconsciousness or even death before reaching a hospital. In the U.S., the prevalence of unruptured aneurysms is about 1 in 50, with a diagnosis average age of 50, & it's more common in women.

The exact cause of aneurysms is unknown, but high blood pressure, smoking, family history, and certain genetic conditions contribute to their formation. Diagnosis involves CT or MRI scans with angiography, followed by detailed imaging via catheter angiography.

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
66Treatment varies based on whether an aneurysm has ruptured. For ruptured aneurysms, emergency treatment is crucial, while unruptured ones are managed electively. Treatment methods include surgical clipping or endovascular coiling. Coiling, a

less invasive technique introduced about 30 years ago, is now widely used. Newer treatments like flow-diverters offer promising results for challenging cases. Advances in medical science have greatly improved the management of these critical conditions?
