Karnataka's Rising Milk Prices: A Path to Malnutrition?



The recent increase of ₹4 per litre in milk prices in Karnataka has sparked widespread concern, particularly for low-income families. The government claims this hike is intended to support dairy farmers and those dependent on animal husbandry. However, when viewed alongside the continuous price hikes in essential commodities and services over the past two years, it raises serious questions about the financial burden being placed on ordinary citizens

Since 2023, the state has witnessed a sharp increase in petrol and diesel taxes, stamp duties, alcohol taxes, bus fares, and metro fares. Now, milk-a fundamental

source of nutrition, especially for children-has also become more expensive. While the government is focused on sustaining its welfare schemes, it appears to be shifting the financial strain onto the common people.

This is particularly alarming when considering Karnataka's history with mal-During nutrition. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's previous tenure, the government introduced the Ksheera Bhagya scheme, which provided school children with milk two or three times a week to combat malnutrition. At the time, the scheme was hailed as a significant step towards improving child health. However, the recent price hike directly contradicts this effort, making it harder for many families—especially migrant and daily wage workers-to afford milk for their children.

For these families, even the current price of milk is a struggle. With yet another increase, many children may be deprived of essential nutrients, potentially leading to a rise in malnutrition rates. If milk, an essential dietary staple, continues to become unaffordable, the state may soon witness a crisis affecting the most vulnerable sections of society.

G The government must find

a balanced approach—one that supports dairy farmers while ensuring essential nutrition remains within reach for all. Otherwise, Karnataka risks reversing its progress in tackling malnutrition, pushing thousands of children into nutritional insecurity.??

Helmet Safety for Kids: What Will It Take to Change?



Despite growing awareness, real-life incidents in Bengaluru continue to show how children's safety is being compromised.

In February, a tragic accident in Whitefield took the life of a 10-year-old boy riding pillion with his mother-neither wore helmets. Near Bannerghatta Road, another child suffered severe head injuries when a two-wheeler skidded on a

pothole. These aren't isolated cases. In 2024 alone, over 270 accidents involved children on two-wheelers, with head injuries in nearly 60% of them.

A 2024 study revealed that children are 93% less likely to wear proper helmets than adults. Many wear poor-quality helmets or none at all.

What's worse-this is not just unsafe, it's illegal. Under

Section 138(7) of the Central Motor Vehicle Act, 2022, kids above 4 must wear BIS-certified helmets and a safety harness. Violating this rule means a ₹1,000 fine & a three-month suspension of the rider's license.

Parents, skipping a helmet is not a small oversight—it's a life risk. No class or errand is worth more than your child's safety.

Act now. Buy a proper helmet. Use a safety harness. Set the example.

Let's not wait for another tragedy to make the change.






